Specials and Spirits Inside Our House

Our House, in Farmingdale, holds a lot of history within its walls, and a couple of ghosts too.

RICH HISTORY

The restaurant, pub and banquet hall has been standing since 1747, before the Revolution, and operated for years under the name Mariner's Tavern.

The restaurant was a well known meeting place for town meetings, dances, weddings and even played a role as the watering hole of the "Fagen Gang," according to the website and bar manager, AJ Chaykoski.

"There's a lot of history in this place," said Chaykoski.

Even the infamous "Hanging Tree" was located on the Our House property.

"If someone was prosecuted, they were sentenced to the 'Hanging Tree' until the 1930's, when it was outlawed," explained Chaykoski.

LUCY'S PUB

The pub at Our House, has been open for about five months and is home to resident ghost Lucy.

Lucy, who was an owner back in the 40s, according to Chaykoski, is the Pub's namesake.

"Lucy died in the room upstairs," said Chaykoski. "We've had a couple of [psychic] mediums here, and they've said she's the only ghost here."

Chaykoski also mentioned that Lucy loves to play tricks on the staff and guests of Our House and Lucy's Pub.

"The other day she blew three tap handles right off on me," said Chaykoski. "When we have glasses facing up in the banquet hall, she'll flip them upside down.

"She loves to hang out in the ladies room. When customers are finished washing their hands, and they look in the mirror, she's right behind them, it's her favorite prank."

Chaykoski insists Lucy's pranks are all in good fun. The Our House staff used to hold ghost tours, but for now you can experience Lucy's form of fun by simply hanging out in her pub.





OUR HOUSE RESTAURANT AND BANQUET HALL

Under new management, Our House Restaurant and Banquet Hall are perfect for a night out to dine, or for a wedding, anniversary or any reason to celebrate.

NIGHT AND DAY

Vic's Restaurant has been drawing generations to its Bradley Beach location since the 1940s. Keeping everything simple and homemade, customers can enjoy their favorite meal without any variations.

FAMILY HISTORY

Vittorio "Vic" Giunco and his wife, Carmella, immigrated from Italy in 1910.

Starting with many small businesses — Vic even owned a speakeasy during Prohibition — he eventually came around to the idea of owning a bar.

Once the ban was lifted, Vic's Tap Room opened in the 1930's in the center of Bradley Beach.

Vic later acquired a larger piece of property, where the Vic's Restaurant we all know and love now presides.

Still managed by family — current fourthgeneration family members — Vic's will always be the culinary home away from home for many customers near and far.

"We have pictures when you first walk in," said General Manager Travis Semblewski, a fourthgeneration family member. "You can see Vic and his family, along with the first liquor license from Vic's Tap Room."

TRADITION

From the front end of Vic's to the back of the house, everything has been the same for 70 years.

"We are very consistent," said Semblewski. "The guy who makes all the sauces has been here for 40 years. The 'newbie' here is one of our chefs and he's been here for 20 [years]."

The kitchen is the domain of four main chefs, who instill the same flavor in every dish, no matter what day of the week.

Vic's not only has the same staff, but the menu has rarely changed since the eatery opened its doors in 1947.

"That's why I feel people love coming here, that sense of familiarity," added Semblewski.

He also shared that people dining at Vic's usually stick with their favorite dish.

"I meet people who find out I work at Vic's and tell me our Lasagna is 'their thing,' " he said. And, the community around Vic's is stronger than ever.

Long time regular Ed Malkin has been passing by 'hundreds of pizza places,' since the 1950's on his way to eat at Vic's.

"It's worth the trip," said Malkin. "And it's always the same, it's the spot to be."

70TH ANNIVERSARY

On March 17, Vic's doors will officially have been open for 70 years.

Keeping the celebration low key, Vic's is hanging banners, putting out special placemats and, of course, selling T-shirts.

"I've seen people come have dinner here wearing a shirt from our 50th [anniversary] celebration," said Semblewski.

"We don't want to do anything big. It's a Friday night, we don't want to create a longer wait for people."

Harpoon Willy's is a Jersey Shore institution, bringing strangers together as friends over a drink and a great meal.

HARPOON'S HISTORY

The old-fashioned building that houses one of the most popular local restaurants in the area, was built circa 1792, according to Wall Township tax records.

The site served as the last coach stop before crossing over the Lower Manasquan River Bridge.

With this rich history, Harpoon Willy's retains some of the original brickwork and beams that are still apart of the foundation.

Today, Harpoon Willy's is one of the more popular watering holes for locals and visitors alike.

FRIENDLY FACES

Walking into the restaurant and bar is more than just a dining experience. Chances are, sitting at the bar you either know someone, or will get to know someone.

"It's a very local and friendly bar," said Manager Holly Lambert. "You can come here by yourself and create a friendship with the person next to you."

Longstanding friendships brought together by Harpoon Willy's are common.

"It's just a warm place to be," added Lambert."

FAVORITE MENU

Chances are if you have eaten at Harpoon Willy's you have a favorite menu item and tend to stick with it.

The burgers seem to take the bill when it comes to top meals on the menu, along with the pork chops and the seared sesame crusted tuna.

HALF MOON POINT

Soon-to-be sister restaurant of Harpoon Willy's, Half Moon Point, in Point Pleasant Borough, will have a similar menu to the Manasquan/Wall restaurant.

According to Lambert, who will be the general manager of the Point Borough tavern, the menu will touch on the cuisine of Harpoon Willy's but don't expect an exact replica of the menu.

"We are going with the same concept," said Lambert. "We want to cater to the neighborhood, and carry the same local concept from Harpoon Willy's to Point Pleasant."

Half Moon Point will also host a similar rotation when it comes to craft beers, and Lambert insists the wine specials will be no less than excellent.

As for an opening date, it is still up in the air, but hopes are high for the new restaurant to open it's doors fairly soon.


